- The State Minister for Social welfare Mr. Madan Dilawar ensured participants that he will look into the matter seriously and there will be no such problem in future.
- The Director of Social Welfare Sh. S. C. Derashree ensured that JJBs in all the districts will be formed within the month coming to facilitate the process and proper implementation.

Satya is further planning to establish Child Guidance Center, Childline, establishing ACA in the state of Rajasthan for streamlining the adoption processes and related things, organizing more seminars on the issue, and further facilitating the implementation of JJ act.
